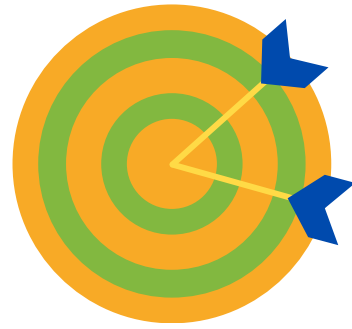

# CHILDREN WHO BENEFITED FROM COMPREHENSIVE WRAP-AROUND SUPPORT





This year, we distributed comprehensive school material packages to **433** students from vulnerable families, including **270** children from our beneficiaries and **163** P1 students of EP MBARE who are unable to afford scholastic materials.

This initiative aims to enhance school performance by providing essential tools for academic success. By equipping these young learners with the necessary school materials, we are actively contributing to improved educational outcomes and fostering a supportive learning environment within the community.

In the 2023-2024 period, our wrap-around assistance to children continued to flourish, establishing **four** key talent categories: Drawing & Art, Traditional Dance, Reading & Storytelling, and Football. Through our Talent Detection Program, **453** children who previously lacked opportunities to showcase their abilities participated in talent detection activities across these categories. This program has not only provided a platform for these young talents to shine but also enabled them to demonstrate their skills and passions beyond the classroom.

During the last academic year, we are also proud to report that **100%** of our **32** Primary 6 students who sat for the Primary Leaving Examination achieved marks that qualified them for secondary school. We are committed to continuing this positive trend and ensuring that every child receives the support they need to succeed academically and beyond.



During the last academic year, all **32** of our Primary 6 students who sat for the Primary Leaving Examination achieved outstanding results, earning marks that qualified them for secondary school. This remarkable 100% success rate reflects the dedication of our students, the support of their families, and the unwavering commitment of our educators. It is a testament to our comprehensive educational programs and the wrap-around support that empowers each child to reach their full potential.

This year, our Talent Detection Program provided an enriching opportunity for **23** children specializing in drawing and art. They visited Muhanga Youth Centre, and provided with an invaluable opportunity for these young artists to explore a diverse range of artworks and engage in open discussions with established artists. By interacting with their peers and learning from experienced artists, the trip ignited their creativity and broadened their artistic perspectives.



# EMPOWERING LIVES OF ADULTS VIA LITERACY: GRADUATION OF ADULT LEARNERS FROM COMMUNITY LITERACY SCHOOLS





This year, Hope of Family proudly supported the graduation of **281 adults** from the Community Adult Literacy School. This achievement highlights our commitment to lifelong learning and empowerment, as these individuals have gained valuable skills and knowledge to improve their lives and contribute positively to their communities as well as children's education. This educational empowerment is a cornerstone of our mission, aligning seamlessly with our broader goal of enhancing children's education and fostering a culture of learning across all ages.

By investing in adult education, we continue to foster personal growth and socio-economic development, creating a brighter future for all involved. As we look to the future, we remain committed to expanding our efforts and building upon this success, ensuring that more individuals can experience the transformative power of education.

In our ongoing efforts to support adult literacy, we have also made significant strides in improving community access to information. As part of establishing a community library, we digitized **7 library titles**, making valuable resources more accessible to the surrounding community. Additionally, we developed **3 new titles** focused on critical issues: 2 addressing malnutrition and 1 on pig farming. These new resources aim to further support our community's needs and contribute to a brighter, more informed future for all of the community we serve.





# **PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT IN CHILDREN EDUCATION: FAMILIES TRAINED AND ENGAGED IN CHILDREN'S EDUCATION**



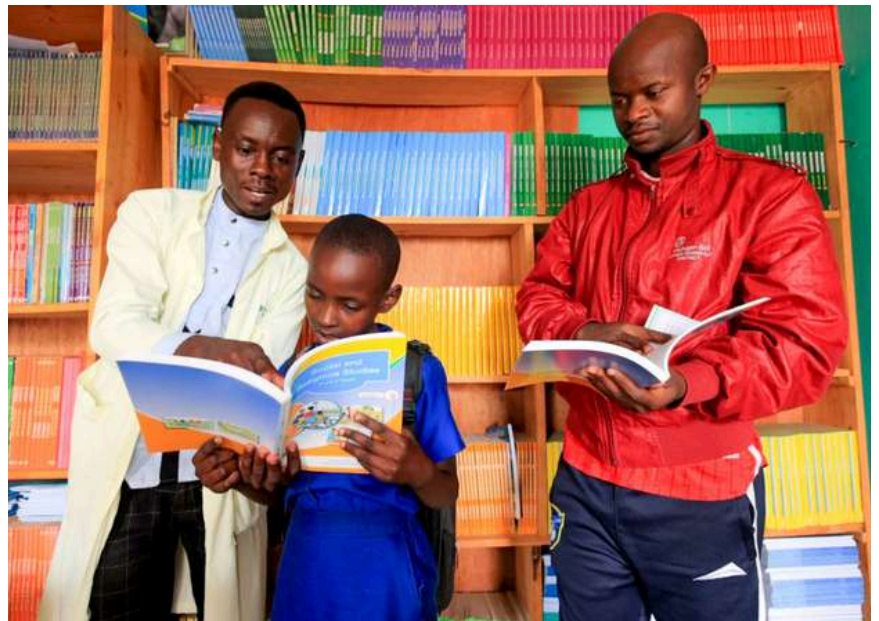


This year, our efforts in promoting parental involvement and nutrition have yielded remarkable outcomes. We successfully trained 100 heads of beneficiary households on their crucial role in children's education. In addition to this, they were educated on preparing balanced diets to combat child malnutrition and establishing kitchen gardens to support this initiative. Financial literacy training was also provided to encourage savings for children's education and overall family welfare.

Our outreach campaigns were extensive, impacting 1,641 parents and community members in the Shyogwe sector. Through these campaigns, we trained 100 household heads and engaged 300 community members via community assignments. The campaign also reached 60 parents of children enrolled in Early Childhood Development (ECD) programs, and 281 parents who graduated from our Community Adult Literacy School received valuable insights on their role in children's education.

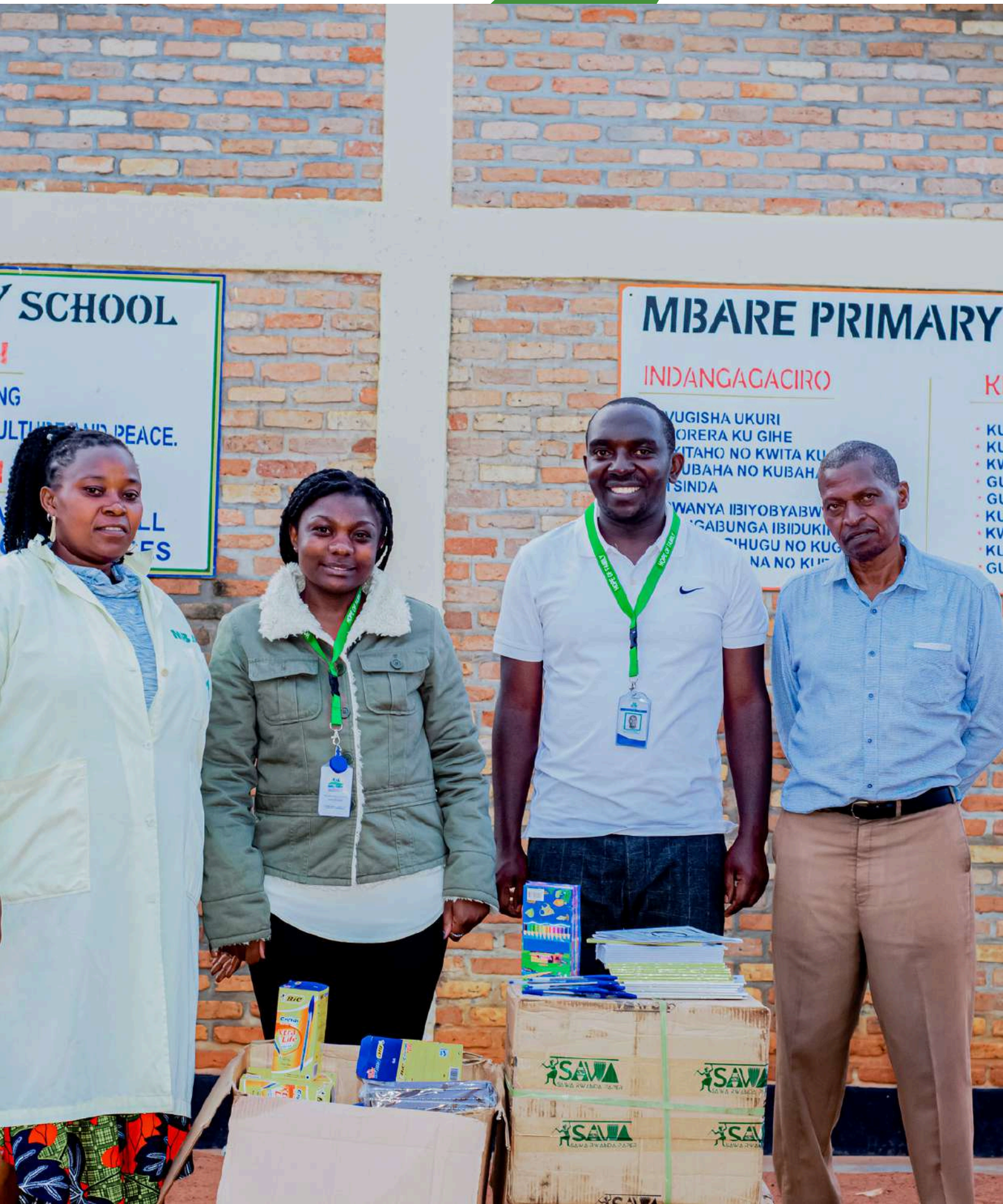
In collaboration with our partner Pueri Cantores, we reached an additional 400 individuals through mobilization campaigns. Our partnership with EP Mbare further extended our reach, as over 500 parents attending school meetings were encouraged to actively participate in their children's education and maintain kitchen gardens for balanced diets.

As a result of these initiatives, 80% of those mobilized and trained have actively visited their children at school. particularly, 83% of parents from supported families make a monthly visits. These visits reflect the positive impact of our training on understanding the importance of engagement in children's education and maintaining communication with teachers.





# STRENGTHENING EDUCATION AT MBARE PRIMARY SCHOOL



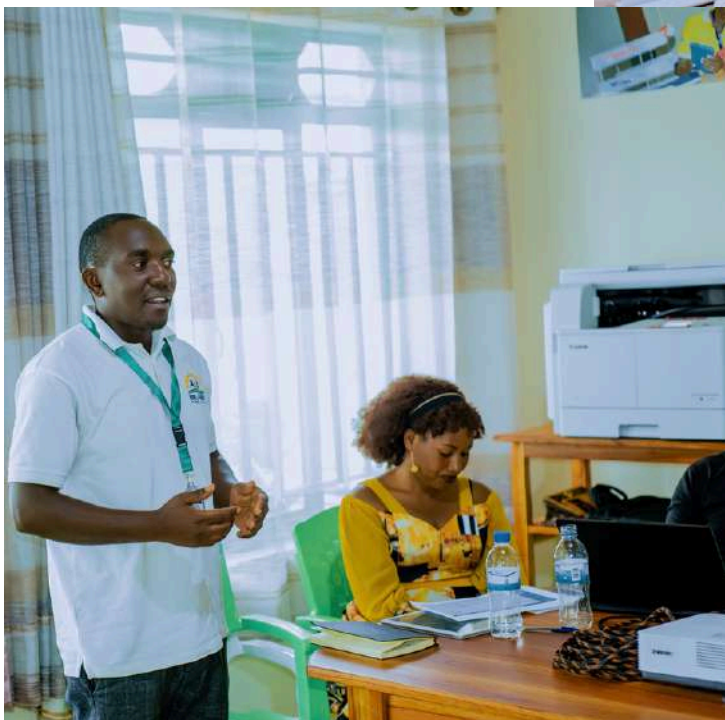


In alignment with our mission to enhance children's education, we extended our support to EP Mbare Primary School, where 90% of our supported children are enrolled. Our intervention followed a thorough analysis identifying critical issues such as financial constraints for parents and inadequate teaching methodologies contributing to poor national exam performance.

To address these challenges, this year, we initiated a targeted support program for Primary 1 (P1) students. This included providing **163 students** with essential school materials to boost attendance, participation, and academic performance. Additionally, **two** P1 teachers and the headteacher received specialized training on improving teaching outcomes, effective strategies, and best practices. The training was further reinforced by the presence of the District Education Officer and Sector Education Inspector.

We also conducted **three** bilateral meetings with EP Mbare's administration to discuss the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), the distribution of scholastic materials, teacher training, and strategies for effective program implementation and monitoring. These efforts aim to lay a strong foundation for improving educational outcomes at EP Mbare and foster a collaborative approach to addressing educational challenges.

As a result of these efforts, the 2023-2024 academic results showed significant improvement, with over **81%** of the targeted P1 students performing better and now progressing to P2 in next academic year





# LAUNCH OF YOUTH ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM





This year, we proudly launched the Youth Economic Empowerment Program, aimed at supporting youth over 18 years old from vulnerable families who were unable to continue their studies due to financial constraints. The program provides these young individuals with opportunities to attend a Leadership Academy and offers scholarships for selected participants to pursue vocational education and training (TVET).

In its inaugural year, a total of **62 youth** (41 females and 21 males) attended the Leadership Academy, receiving training in Entrepreneurship, Leadership, Reproductive Health, and Human Rights Education. This comprehensive training equipped them with the knowledge and skills to pursue entrepreneurship, understand their rights and responsibilities, develop leadership qualities, and gain essential insights into reproductive health and human rights.

Out of these participants, **49 youth** (35 females and 14 males) were awarded scholarships to attend TVET schools. They enrolled in courses such as Tailoring, Welding, Masonry, and Carpentry. The objective of this initiative is to empower these young individuals by providing them with practical skills that enable them to create their own employment opportunities or become competitive candidates in the labor market and then support their families in return.

As of today, we are pleased to report that all 49 students successfully completed their TVET studies: 25 in Tailoring, 17 in Welding, 3 in Masonry, and 3 in Carpentry. This achievement marks a significant step towards their economic empowerment and the overall betterment of their communities.

# ENHANCING SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS AND WELL-BEING





## Sustainable Income Generating Activities

This fiscal year, we have significantly increased the socio-economic status of families through the establishment of sustainable income-generating activities and small businesses. We financially supported **16 saving and credit groups**, comprising **200** people in total. Each group initiated their own income-generating activities, including tailoring centers and modern rabbit farms. Impressively, 75% of these group members have already started their individual income-generating ventures.

### Empowering Families through Livestock Provision

We also focused on empowering families by providing livestock. **Six families**, previously in extreme conditions, received a pig each. This provision not only improved their living conditions through access to manure for cultivation but also positively impacted their children's education by creating a more stable home environment.

### House Renovation

In our ongoing efforts to alleviate poverty, we contributed to the renovation of **seven houses** belonging to selected families living in dire conditions. These homes were at risk of collapse, and our intervention has ensured that these families now live in safer, more secure conditions, enhancing their overall well-being and positively affecting their children's education.

### Community-Based Health Insurance

Recognizing the importance of health in educational success, we paid for one-year community-based health insurance for **2,000 vulnerable people** in Shyogwe sector. This initiative ensures that these families, including children, have access to public health services, leading to improved health and education outcomes.

These interventions have reflected our commitment to creating sustainable and holistic improvements in the lives of the families we serve, paving the way for a brighter future for their children.





# COMBATING MALNUTRITION IN EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT





This fiscal year, Hope of Family intensified its efforts to combat malnutrition among children under five years old by expanding our initiatives to Home-based Early Childhood Development (ECD) centers. Recognizing the severe impact of malnutrition on physical and cognitive development, which hampers effective learning, we targeted **four Home-based ECD centers** in Kinini cells.

In these centers, we introduced a comprehensive program that includes the provision of a balanced diet featuring porridge, eggs, and vegetables from kitchen gardens established at each ECD center. This initiative directly benefited **60 children** by improving their nutritional intake.

Our commitment extended to the families of these children, with **160 parents** receiving monthly training on how to prepare balanced diets. This training also empowered these parents to reach their fellow with an additional **480 community members** through subsequent assignments.

Moreover, Hope of Family's broader outreach efforts included campaigns that reached **1,681** parents and community members in the Shyogwe sector. Our informative post boards, placed across 29 villages, conveyed balanced diet preparation messages to **10,850 individuals**.





# **EMPOWERING CHANGE THROUGH COLLECTIVE ACTION: A SUCCESS STORY FROM OUR PEER DRIVEN CHANGE (PDC) PROGRAM**

In 2023, we witnessed the transformative power of community collaboration through our Peer Driven Change (PDC) Program. We're excited to share an inspiring story from these change makers! This program is built on the belief that when people come together, they can share skills and strengths to transform their lives and the community.

Meet one of our amazing groups, originally formed with **10 people**. Before joining the group, 5 members had tailoring skills. Through weekly meetings and mutual support, among group, they taught the entire group how to sew.

Driven by their collective talent and a desire to address youth unemployment in our community, they started a tailoring center offering affordable training to unemployed youth around community. This center is a beacon of hope, providing valuable skills and creating job opportunities for young people.

With just **5 sewing machines** initially, the group pooled their savings and bought 7 more through financial support received from Hope of Family. Their dedication paid off—**15 youths** have already graduated, equipped with the skills to launch their own tailoring businesses or secure employment. Now, they're excitedly teaching a second cohort of students.

This group's journey is a testament to the power of peer-driven change initiatives. They've not only uplifted themselves but have also made a significant impact on our community.





## SPECIAL EVENTS ATTENDED







From October 15-19, 2023, Hope of Family had the honor of attending the OC 2023 conference held in the Dominican Republic. As one of the local organizations in East Africa funded by the Woven Foundation under their East Africa Portfolio, this opportunity was significant for our team.

The four-day global gathering provided a unique platform for Hope of Family to connect with like-minded individuals and organizations dedicated to making a positive societal impact. Throughout the conference, our team engaged in collaborative discussions, shared best practices, and expanded our network, all of which are crucial for the continuous improvement of our organization's efforts.

The OC 2023 conference reinforced the importance of collective action and collaboration in driving meaningful change. It allowed us to gather valuable insights and strategies that we can integrate into our programs, ultimately contributing to the betterment of the communities we serve.







Hope of Family had the privilege of participating in the two-day National Foundational Learning Symposium 2024, themed "Delivery for Learning - Implementation of the Foundational Learning Strategy for Improved Learning Outcomes in Early Grades." This symposium marked the 5th consecutive convening since its inception in 2021 and provided an invaluable platform for partners and stakeholders to engage in robust discussions and share experiences.

During the symposium, key points of discussion focused on how parents can best support children to enhance learning both at school and at home. Mobilizing the community and parents for enhanced learning outcomes was also a significant topic.



The event featured distinguished speakers such as Hon. Gaspard Twagirayezu, Minister of Education; Dr. Sahr Kpundeh, Country Manager for World Bank Rwanda; and Dr. Aliou Tall, Education Office Director at USAID/Rwanda, alongside Dr. Bernard Bahati, Director General of NESA, among others. Their expertise enriched the forum, covering topics ranging from "Strengthening Instruction, Curriculum, and Materials for Better Foundational Learning" to "Parent and Community Support and Measuring Learning Outcomes."

The knowledge gained from this symposium has been instrumental in shaping our approach to improving early-grade learning outcomes. We have taken inspiration from the discussions to enhance our initiatives, particularly by extending our efforts into four Home-based Early Childhood Development Centers (ECDs) and developing new strategies to engage more parents in their children's education. These steps are crucial in fostering a supportive and effective learning environment for the children in our community.

1. **Expanding Support for Children:** In 2025, Hope of Family will increase the number of children receiving scholastic materials, ensuring they have the necessary resources to succeed in their basic education.
2. **Recruiting New Beneficiaries:** Recognizing the high demand for support within our community, toward 2025, Hope of Family will actively recruit new direct beneficiaries to extend our reach and impact.
3. **Parental Training:** For newly recruited beneficiaries, Hope of Family will provide comprehensive parental training to equip parents with the skills and knowledge to support their children's education effectively.
4. **Youth Economic Empowerment Program:** In 2025, Hope of Family planned to expand Youth Economic Empowerment Program by recruiting new cohort of youth participants, providing them with opportunities to attend leadership academy and send them to TVET schools.
5. **Small Business Creation and Job Connections:** We will support youth who have completed their TVET school studies by helping them create small businesses and connecting them with entrepreneurs to secure job opportunities.
6. **Parental Involvement:** Toward 2025, Hope of Family will seals a significant increase in the reach of parental involvement campaigns, engaging a larger number of community members in supporting children's education.
7. **Fighting Malnutrition:** We will expand our efforts to combat malnutrition in children under five by increasing support through our Early Childhood Development (ECD) centers.
8. **Enhancing Family Socio-Welfare:** We will increase the number of families improving their socio-welfare through the creation and expansion of Savings and Credit Groups, provision of livestock, housing renovations, and ensuring safe living conditions
9. **Socio-Enterprise Initiative:** Hope of Family will proudly open a socio-enterprise to support the sustainability of organizational work, ensuring long-term impact and stability.
10. **Fundraising Activities:** To support our expanded activities, in 2025, we will engage in fundraising efforts aimed at securing the necessary operational budget.
